URBANA AND URBANA/CHAMPAIGN/CHAMPAIGN COUNTY HOME CONSORTIUM FY 2002-2003 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN, FY 2001-2002 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN, FY 2000-2001 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN AND

FY 1998-1999 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

Description

Staff has identified a number of necessary amendments that need to be made to the CDBG and HOME Programs under the current Annual Action Plan for FY 2002-2003 and minor amendments to the FY 2001-2002 and FY 2000-2001 Annual Action Plans. As lead entity for the Urbana HOME Consortium, staff is also providing for an amendment to the FY 1998-1999 Annual Action Plan that will reflect the City of Champaign's programming decisions for use of its separate HOME funding allocation.

Issues

Per the provisions included in the Consolidated Plan, any substantial amendments to a City of Urbana and Urbana HOME Consortium Annual Action Plan must be approved by the Urbana City Council prior to submission to HUD.

Background

Urbana City Council approved Resolution 2002-04-013R, approving the FY 2002-2003 Annual Action Plan (AAP), on May 6, 2002.

The Urbana Community Development Commission considered changes to the FY 2002-2003, FY 2001-2002 and FY 2000-2001 Annual Action Plans at their October 22, 2002 regular meeting and recommended that the amendments to be forwarded to City Council for approval.

Staff has provided for the required 30-day Public Comment Period and Public Hearing. The Public Hearing was held at 10:00 AM, November 26, 2002. The Public Comment Period is from November 12, 2002 through December 11, 2002. To date, staff has not received any comments

on the proposed amendments. Staff will forward any comments received between December 5 and December 11, 2002 to Council, prior to the December 16, 2002.

The proposed amendments are necessary to account for fiscal, programming and administrative changes that have transpired since the initial approval of the Annual Action Plans. Many of the proposed amendments are "housekeeping" type items. This is particularly the case in regard to the FY 1998-1999 amendments which simply reflect decisions made by the City of Champaign for the utilization of their separate HOME allocation.

Amendments to the Annual Action Plans are listed below.

FY 2002-2003 CDBG Activities

Administration

Delete paragraphs referencing potential future funding. A portion of UCAN funding was mistakenly in the original AAP. However, additional funding is allocated to provide the \$2,500 requested. The balance of funds available to expend under the administration cap is \$6,350. This provides a contingency in the event that an administration line item is exceeded. However, this leaves no funding for planning and capacity building pursuits requested by the Lakeside Residents Council.

Public Facilities and Improvements

Prairie Center Health Systems, Inc.

Change the Prairie Center Project narrative to read as follows:

Funding goal for this project is \$100,000 in CDBG funds over a two-year period for the <u>renovation</u>, purchase or construction of a facility to house residential and <u>/or</u> outpatient services for persons suffering from substance abuse

Adding "renovation" and "or" provides Prairie Center with the flexibility to use CDBG funds to make improvements to their Hill St. facility in Champaign. In order to use funding for the renovation of their Hill Street facility, Prairie Center would have to ask that their CDBG agreement be amended to pursue such an arrangement.

Street Reconstruction

Move \$185,553 from the Street Reconstruction Project, into the Streetlight Replacement Project. City Council approved Budget Amendment Ordinance 2002-09-105 which provides for amendment to the City budget. This arrangement was designed to improve the timeliness of CDBG expenditures and complete the project in a cost effective manner. The Street Reconstruction Project, is reduced to a \$0.00 balance is removed from the AAP. Public Works staff has indicated that until the County and City agree on engineering and drainage concerns, this project is prepared to proceed. It will be included in the AAP at a later time when the project is ready to move forward.

Streetlight Replacement

The Streetlight Replacement Project budget is increased by \$185,553 for a total budget amount of \$335,553.

CDBG Carryover Activities

Property Acquisition in Support of New Construction (CO 01-02)

Delete the following: \$10,000 of these funds will be committed to the Illinois Center for Citizen Involvement to investigate and identify lots to be acquired by the City for new housing construction.

FY 2002-2003 HOME ACTIVITIES

Listed below are the proposed HOME amendments to the FY 2002-2003 Annual Action Plan.

Administration

Change the travel line item from \$4,644 to \$4,078. This reduction of \$566 provides for a necessary mathematical adjustment.

Community Development Housing Organization (CHDO) 15% Set Aside

Change language to identify Homestead Corporation as the recipient of these funds. This will be of assistance to Homestead by providing additional funding to aid in the completion the Eads at Lincoln Project.

Community Development Housing Organization (CHDO) Operating Funds

Change language to identify Homestead Corporation as the recipient. This will be of assistance to Homestead by providing additional funding to aid in the completion of the Eads at Lincoln Project.

City of Urbana

Property Acquisition

Change language to read as follows: Funds will be used to provide the five (5) remaining lots associated with the Eads at Lincoln Homebuyer Assistance Project with the necessary utilities and infrastructure to support affordable housing.

FY 2001-2002 HOME ACTIVITIES

City of Urbana

HomeBuildIV

The project is deleted as the Illinois Center for Citizen Involvement has indicated that they they not intend to pursue the completion of this project. Project funding is allocated to the Eads at Lincoln Project.

If other homebuyer subsidies are secured, the entire \$101,265 may not be required. However, staff would like to ensure that in the event that no other homebuyer subsidies are secured, there are resources available to complete the project.

FY 2000-2001 HOME ACTIVITIES

Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs)

Eads at Lincoln Project

Increase total project funding from \$126,135 to \$227,400. The additional \$101,265 is from the HomeBuild IV project referenced earlier in the FY 2001-2002 AAP.

A copy of the edited version of the FY 2000-2001 Annual Action Plan is attached.

FY 1998-1999 HOME ACTIVITIES

City of Champaign HOME Allocation

ICFCI/HomeBuild3 Program Downpayment Assistance

Program funding is reduced from \$82,963 (\$66,370 HOME/\$16,593 Match) to a lesser amount of \$43,580.

Rehabilitation of Owner-Occupied Housing

Program funding is reduced from \$374,191 (\$299,353 HOME/\$74,838 Match) to a lesser amount of \$156,420.

Oakwood Terrace

The project is inserted into the program year as a new project, funded in the same amount of \$200,000. This funding is realized through the reductions noted in the funding adjustments above.

An electronic copy of the FY 1998-1999 Annual Action Plan is not available. Staff prepared a new cover sheet and a summary text to reflect the proposed amendment.

Options

City Council has the options of approving or not approving the proposed amendments in part or in their entirety.

Fiscal Impacts

The amended Annual Action Plans remains fiscally constrained by the level of funding provided in each program year. Funding is available to meet all HOME/CDBG obligations identified in the amended plans.

Recommendations

At its October 23rd meeting, the Urbana Community Development Commission recommended that the amended Annual Action Plans be forwarded to City Council for approval. Community Development staff concurs with this recommendation.

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana has been designated an entitlement city under the Federal Housing and Community Development act of 1974, as amended, and as such is eligible for Community Development Block (hereinafter "CDBG") and Home Investment Partnership Funds (hereinafter "HOME") funds upon proper submittal being made to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (hereinafter "HUD"); and

WHEREAS, the Urbana City Council previously approved resolutions authorizing submittal to HUD of the Annual Action Plan for FY 2002-2003, Annual Action Plan for FY 2001-2002, Annual Action Plan for FY 2000-2001 and Annual Action Plan for FY 1998-1999 that included proposed budgets for the CDBG and HOME Programs and HUD subsequently approved the said Annual Action Plans; and

WHEREAS, on November 10, 2002, the City of Urbana published in the Champaign-Urbana News-Gazette a notice of a 30-day public review period regarding said proposed budgetary amendments to the Annual Action Plan for FY 2002-2003, Annual Action Plan for FY 2001-2002, Annual Action Plan for FY 2000-2001 and FY Annual Action Plan for 1998-1999; and

WHEREAS, on November 26, 2002, the Urbana Grants Management
Division of the Community Development Department held a public hearing
on the proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now finds it necessary and appropriate to amend the City of Urbana and Champaign/Urbana/Champaign County HOME Consortium Annual Action Plan for FY 2002-2003, Annual Action Plan for

FY 2001-2002, Annual Action Plan for FY 2000-2001 and Annual Action Plan for FY 1999-1998.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. While this project is located outside the City's CDBG jurisdiction, it is necessary to its community development and Consolidated Plan objectives. Transitional Housing for Homeless Families With Children (FY 02/03) Funds will be contributed to the City of Urbana's transitional housing program. Five dwellings are available for homeless families with children. Rent receipts will be another source of revenue.
