This Ordinance:
AMENDS the Code of Ordinances.

ORDINANCE NO. 2005-03-048

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE LIQUOR CODE (NUMBER OF T-2 LICENSES WITH CITY AS CO-SPONSOR)

WHEREAS, the Code of Ordinances of the City presently places an annual limit of no more than two T-2 (civic or charitable organization) liquor licenses per year for any particular entity; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Urbana seeks to encourage additional city-sponsored festivals; and

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana expects to co-sponsor more than two festivals per year with some entities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> That Section 3-42(b)(4) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Urbana is amended to change the maximum number of T-2 (civic or charitable organization) liquor licenses, so that there is no cap on the number of licenses issued when the City of Urbana co-sponsors an event. Section 3-42(b)(4), after amendment, shall read as follows:

(4) Not more than two (2) Class T-2 licenses shall be issued to any license holder in any one (1) calendar year. Licenses issued for events that the City of Urbana co-sponsors shall not count toward this limit.

<u>Section 2.</u> The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form by authority of the corporate authorities, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a meeting of said Council.
