the Americas. It is celebrated across the United States, and is an official city

and state holiday in various localities around the country; and

WHEREAS, Indigenous Peoples Day allows for all people to honor their origins and

ancestors who overcame challenges so that one day their descendants might reap the reward of living equally and peacefully with one another and with the

earth; and

WHEREAS, Indigenous People have made many positive contributions to present day

society nationally and locally; and

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana urges all citizens to learn more about the cultures,

contributions and values of Indigenous Peoples.
