• Accomplishments and how grant funds were utilized during the grant period

The BBL Summer Jazz Camp was held June 13-17, 2017 at the School Of Music Building. There were concurrent sessions for beginning, intermediate, and advanced students. The age ranges were 10-18. The camp theme was "Music of New Orleans". Instruction was offered in brass, reeds, keyboard, guitar, percussion, bucket drumming, and vocal. The students were also exposed to listening and history sessions each day of the camp. All lessons contained examples and information regarding the musical heritage of New Orleans, including Latin American music, African rhythms, jazz, and popular music. The grant funds were used to supplement the cost of several instructors.

• Impact that the grant funds had on your artistic or organizational development The grant funds allowed us to hire sufficient instructors to keep the teacher/student ration low so that students could receive the maximum benefit for the week-long ensemble and small group sessions. We were also able to hire a camp logistics person charged with all correspondence and camp registration procedures.

The U of I School of Music Outreach Office partnered with the program by providing on-line registration, eight classrooms, and office assistance with materials. The Office of Equal Opportunity and Access assisted with a \$5,000 grant for the camp.

• Any additional comments

The dollar amount provided by the Office of Equal Opportunity and Access was \$2,000 less this year than previous years, due to the lack of a state budget. The camp would not have been possible without the assistance of the Urbana Arts Commission grant. BBL is very grateful for the opportunity to continue providing affordable summer experiences for underrepresented students. Unfortunately, the drumline which was also scheduled has been delayed due to the equipment ordering protocol of the Champaign Park District. We will focus on this project during the fall of 2016.
