

RESOLUTION NO. 8586-R1

RESOLUTION authorizing the execution and delivery of a Memorandum of Intent between the City of Urbana, Champaign County, Illinois, and Electronic Decisions, Inc., an Illinois corporation and Bill J. Hunsinger, of Urbana, Illinois, including a corporation, trust or other business entity to be established by him (as their interests may appear, the proposed "Borrower"), providing for the issuance by said City of Urbana of approximately \$3,200,000 principal amount of revenue bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Enabling Ordinance, as amended.

WHEREAS the City of Urbana, Champaign County, Illinois (the "Issuer") is authorized under the home rule provisions of the Local Governmental Article of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and Ordinance No. 7475-3, Ordinance Authorizing Acquisition, Construction, and Financing Pollution Control Facilities and Economic Development Projects and the Lease, Sale and Financing thereof to or for any Person, and Providing for the Issuance of Revenue Bonds and Establishing Procedures in Respect thereto, passed May 20, 1974, and approved May 21, 1974, and Ordinance No. 8081-37, An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Ordinance No. 7475-3, passed October 6, 1980, and approved October 14, 1980, as from time to time supplemented and amended (collectively the "Enabling Ordinance"), to construct, acquire, reconstruct, improve, better, extend, own, lease, dispose of, or to finance the construction, acquisition, reconstruction, improvement, betterment, or extension of economic development projects (as defined in the Enabling Ordinance) in order to relieve conditions of unemployment, and to encourage the increase and retention of industry and commerce within the State of Illinois, thereby relieving conditions of unemployment and maintaining existing levels of employment; and

WHEREAS the Issuer, in order to implement the public purposes enumerated in the Enabling Ordinance and in furtherance thereof to induce the Borrower to construct, acquire, reconstruct, improve, better, or extend facilities for research, development and production for micro-electronic products within the Issuer's corporate limits at the former Brookens Junior High School site in Urbana, Illinois, including all necessary land, buildings, and equipment (the "Project") has offered to issue its revenue bonds under and pursuant to the provisions of the Enabling Ordinance and to apply the proceeds therefrom to the Borrower or to an entity designated by the Borrower; and

WHEREAS it is now deemed advisable to authorize the execution and delivery by the Issuer of a Memorandum of Intent

expressing formally and in writing the understanding heretofore informally agreed upon by the Issuer and the Borrower:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute a Memorandum of Intent by and between the Issuer and the Borrower, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to affix the seal of the City thereto and to attest the same; and said Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to cause said Memorandum of Intent to be delivered to, accepted and executed by the Borrower, said Memorandum of Intent, which is hereby approved and incorporated by reference and made a part of this authorizing resolution, to be in substantially the form presented to this meeting.

Section 2. That the Mayor be and is hereby designated as the authorized or applicable elected representative of the Issuer in connection with the issuance of the proposed revenue bonds; that public approval of the issuance of such bonds by the City Council is hereby given, as required by Section 103(k) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended; and that the approval by the Mayor of this resolution shall constitute the approval by the authorized or applicable elected representative within the meaning of such Section 103(k).

Section 3. All resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and this resolution shall be in immediate effect from and after its adoption.
