## 1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL AND DECLARATION OF QUORUM

The meeting was called to order at 7:33 p.m. A quorum was declared present.

The minutes for November 18, 1999 were presented for approval. Dr. Stake moved that the minutes be approved as presented. Dr. Kangas seconded the motion. The minutes were approved by unanimous voice vote.

### 7. NEW PUBLIC HEARINGS

There were none.

### 8. NEW BUSINESS

CCZBA-216-99, request by Dale and Pat LaRoe, Ernest Logan, and Robert Mack for a Champaign County Zoning Map Amendment to rezone <u>\*1</u>.14 acres from R-3, Two Family Residence, to B-4, General Business, and <u>\*0.30</u> acres from R-3, Two Family residence, to B-2, Neighborhood Business. These properties are located at 1403 N. Carroll, 1101 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> N. Perkins, 1103 N. Perkins, and 1405 N. Carroll.

Ms. Tyler presented an overview of the issues regarding this case. She concluded with a staff recommendation for a protest of the proposed rezoning for all four of the subject properties based on the lack of conformity with the City's ETJ Plan policies and land use designations and on the potential for negative consequences to surrounding residential properties.

Ms. Winters-Williams asked if the hearing could continue without the petitioner or a representative being present and also asked if anyone knew why the petitioners were not in attendance. Ms. Getchius answered that the hearing could continue without anyone being present to represent the petitioner and that the petitioner had not told anyone that they would not be present. Dr. Howell and Ms. Getchius noted that because the County works on a relatively tight time line they need the input from this hearing as quickly as possible.

Ms. Upah-Bant questioned the fact that the four properties were being presented together in the same case. Ms. Tyler explained that her understanding was that they hoped that by combining the requests they would have the lesser zoning along Carroll and thus have a case that would be more palatable to issues such as spot zoning etc. She also noted that the petitioners could have helped shed some light on these issues if they had been present.

Dr. Stake moved to forward CCZBA-216-99 to the City Council with a recommendation of protest for the rezoning of all four of the subject properties based on the lack of conformity with the City's ETJ plan policies and land use designations and on the potential for negative consequences to surrounding residential property. Ms. Upah-Bant seconded the motion.

Dr. Knaap asked what the best hope for the area might be. Ms. Tyler said that holding the line through enforcement against violations could go far toward keeping this a viable residential area

but she noted that the County does not have the manpower to do much of the policing that needs to be done to achieve that goal. Dr. Knaap then asked whether this area could potentially be annexed to the City. Ms. Getchius replied that the area was relatively distant from the corporate limits and would have to be wholly surrounded before it was incorporated. She added that the ETJ Plan shows the subject portion of the area as residential but areas to the south are shown as Industrial.

Dr. Howell called for a roll call. The vote follows:

The motion passed 7-0.

Dr. Howell forwarded CCZBA-116-00 to the February 21, 2000 meeting of the City Council with a recommendation for protest.
