AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING  
FOR THE INSTALLATION OF PARKING METERS AND  
ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR THEIR USE AND  
OPERATION, ADOPTED AND APPROVED JULY 15, 1946

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
URBANA, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That Section of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Providing For The Installation of Parking Meters and Establishing Regulations For Their Use And Operation" be and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following paragraph in the words and figures as follows:

"It shall be unlawful for any person or operator to park any vehicle for a period of more than two hours in any consecutive three hour period between the hours of 8:30 o'clock A. M. and 6 o'clock P. M. excepting Sundays, New Year's Day, Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day upon that part of Broadway Avenue designated as follows:


On the west side of Broadway beginning at a point 12 feet south of the fire hydrant closest to Elm Street and extending thence south to a point 10 feet north of the north line of Cherry Alley.

On the east side of Broadway beginning at a point five feet south of Cherry Alley and extending thence south to a point 12 feet north of the north line of the turn-in or driveway leading into the Sinclair Service Station from Broadway.


It shall be unlawful for any person or operator to park any vehicle for a period of more than twenty four minutes in any one hour period between the hours of 8:30 o'clock A. M. and six o'clock P. M. excepting Sundays, New Year's Day, Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day upon that part of Broadway Avenue designated as follows:

On the east side of Broadway beginning at a point 42 feet south of the east line of Elm Street, thence south to a point 13 feet north of the north line of Cherry Alley.
