## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PLUMBING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF URBANA, AS ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 4, 1945

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, to promote the health of the people of the City of Urbana by the proper regulation of plumbing fixtures and the disposal of waste products, and

WHEREAS, it is found that the draining of soil and waste pipes from basements into storm drains is detrimental to the public health;

Now, therefore, be it ordained that Article 9, Section 8 of the Plumbing Ordinance of Urbana, as adopted September 4, 1945, is hereby repealed and that hereafter Article 9, Section 8 shall read as follows:

"Section No. 8. BASEMENT FLOOR DRAINS in all new construction and in all connections made after the effective date of this ordinance, shall be connected into the sanitary sewer. All floor drains shall connect directly to the sanitary sewer or with any soil or waste pipe. All basement drains and floor drains shall be considered plumbing fixtures and shall be properly trapped and vented.

"A floor drain connected with the sanitary sewer or shower drain shall be considered a plumbing fixture and provided with a strainer and trap.

"A floor drain may be wet vented through a drain from another fixture, provided fixture is on same floor level with the floor drain.

"Exception: with the permission of the Plumbing Inspector a floor drain may be connected into the storm drainage."
