AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PLANTING OF ELM TREES ON CITY PROPERTY AND STREET RIGHTS-OF-WAY - CITY OF URBANA

WHEREAS, various Cities in the State of Illinois are being put to great expenses for the removal of dead elm trees caused by a disease of an infectuous nature and

WHEREAS, said disease has now come to the area in and about the City of Urbana, Illinois, necessitating the expenditure of large sums of money for the prevention of the spread of the disease and for the removal of trees already affected.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois:-

SECTION 1. That elm trees of no variety shall be allowed to be planted on property belonging to the City of Urbana, or upon any streets, alleys or rights-of-way in the City of Urbana.

SECTION 2. <u>PENALTY</u>: If any said elm trees are planted contrary to the provision of this Ordinance they shall be removed by the City and the cost of removal shall be collected in the form of a penalty in the sum of not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars and not more than Three Huddred (\$300.00) Dollars.
