

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING STORAGE OF COMBUSTABLES
IN THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,

That: -

Section 1. LICENSE REQUIRED. It shall be unlawful within the City of Urbana, Illinois to own, operate, maintain or control any place for the storage of tar, pitch, turpentine, resin, hemp, cotton, gun powder, nitroglycerin, petroleum or any of their products and all other similar combustible or explosive materials/without first having obtained a license for such storage place from the City Clerk of the City of Urbana.

Section 2. FEES FOR LICENSES. The fee to be paid to the City Clerk for an annual license to operate any such storing place, shall be as follows:

Gasoline and petroleum products bulk storage plants	\$100.
Gun powder and nitroglycerin bulk storage plants	100.
Turpentine, tar, pitch, resin, hemp and cotton storage plants including laundries and dry cleaning establishments	10.
Gasoline filling stations - for each 1000 gallons of storage capacity or fraction thereof	10.

Section 3. APPLICATION. Licenses shall be granted under the provisions of this ordinance to persons, firms, or corporations who file an application for such license at the office of the City Clerk of Urbana. Each application shall indicate the name of the person, firm or corporation applying for such license, the type of storage plant for which the license is sought, and the name and address and telephone number of a person to be called in case of emergency. Each application must be accompanied by the above designated fee and all licenses granted hereunder will expire on the 30th day of April, following the date of the license. The City Clerk of Urbana shall furnish to the Fire Marshall of said City, a list of the names and addresses and telephone numbers of the persons to be notified in event of an emergency.

Section 4. REGULATIONS. It shall be unlawful within the City limits of the City of Urbana, Illinois, for any person, firm or corporation engaged in the loading or unloading of gasoline or other explosive or combustible material to leave unattended, any truck, tank-car, bulk storage plant, tank or other storage place into which or from which such materials are being loaded or unloaded.

At all times while gasoline, naphtha or other combustable or inflamable liquid is being unloaded from a gasoline tank truck, the driver, attendant or person in charge of said truck shall stand within three (3) feet of the emergency shut-off valve lever of said tank truck.

It shall further be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to ignite any open fire for the burning of trash, leaves, debris or any other material within One Hundred (100) feet of any bulk storage plant, in which gasoline or any other combustable or explosive material is stored within the City limits of the City of Urbana, Illinois.

It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke any form of tobacco or to ignite, light or burn any material or substance of any kind on the premises where any of the above mentioned combustable materials are stored, loaded or unloaded, unless such smoking, lighting or igniting is done in a closed office or room which contain^sno openings into these storage areas.

Section 5. PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less then \$10 nor more than \$100 for each offense and a separate offense shall be deemed to have been committed during or on each day which a violation occurs or continues.

Section 6. REPEAL. "An Ordinance Regulating the Loading and Unloading of Gasoline and Limiting the Burning of Materials Within One Hundred Feet of Any Bulk Gasoline Storage Plant in the City of Urbana, Illinois," adopted by the City Council on the 16th day of October, A. D. 1950, is hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
