

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE
REGULATING THE SALE AT RETAIL OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR
WITHIN THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, it appears that it would be for the best interests of the people of the City of Urbana to restrict the number and location of retail liquor licenses issued for the sale of alcoholic liquor at locations on Main Street in said City:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That Section 10 of An Ordinance Regulating the Sale at Retail of Alcoholic Liquor Within the City of Urbana, Illinois, adopted by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, on April 2, 1945 and approved by the Mayor on April 6, 1945, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 10: (CHANGE OF LOCATION) A retail liquor dealer's license shall permit the sale of alcoholic liquor only in the premises described in the application and license, and such location may be changed only upon written permit issued by the Mayor or the City Council, but in no event shall a permit be granted by the Mayor for a change of location to any premises on Main Street in Urbana which are not now, as of November 19, 1951, being used for the retail sale of alcoholic liquors. After the date of the adoption and approval of this ordinance no retail liquor dealers' licenses shall be granted for the sale of alcoholic liquor in premises located on Main Street in the City of Urbana, except in premises on said street and at the locations where licenses are now in force; and, in event the sale of alcoholic liquor shall be discontinued for a period of six months in any of the premises which are now being used for the sale of alcoholic liquors on Main Street, then no liquor license shall thereafter be issued for the sale of alcoholic liquor in such premises.
