

AN ORDINANCE VACATING THAT PORTION OF NEVADA STREET BETWEEN WALNUT STREET AND VINE STREET IN THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the adjoining property owners, by proper petition addressed to the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, have asked that the portion of Nevada Street between South Walnut Street and South Vine Street in said City be vacated, and

Whereas, it appears that there are no objectors to the closing of said portion of said street, but that all of the owners of the abutting property have signed said petition requesting such vacation, and

Whereas, it appears to the City Council of the City of Urbana that the public interest would be served by vacating said portion of said street.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois hereby vacates and releases to the owners of the abutting property, all right, title and interest of the City of Urbana to that portion of Nevada Street between South Walnut Street and South Vine Street in said City, which vacated portion of said street is described as follows:

Commencing at the Southeast corner of Lot Five (5) of Fairgrounds Addition in the City of Urbana, Illinois, thence West to the Southwest corner of Lot Four (4) of said Fairgrounds Addition, thence South Fifty feet (50') to the Northwest corner of Leon F. Swartz's Subdivision in the City of Urbana, Illinois, thence East to the Northeast corner of Lot One (1) of said Leon F. Swartz's Subdivision, thence North Fifty feet (50') to the place of beginning.

SECTION 2. The City of Urbana, Illinois hereby reserves an easement or right-of-way upon or under the ground in said street to be used for public utility service and for the installation of sewers and drains.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
