AN ORDINANCE VACATING AN ALLEY

WHEREAS, the adjoining property owners, by proper petition addressed to the City Council of the City of Urbana, have asked for the closing and vacating of an alley running from Main Street to Elm Street approximately midway between Vine Street and Urbana Avenue in the City of Urbana, Illinois, said alley having heretofore separated lots 3 and 6 from lots 2, 7 and 8 in a part of W. T. Webber's Subdivision, and

WHEREAS, it appears that there are no objectors to the closing of said alley, but that all of the owners of the abutting property have signed said petition requesting such vacation, and

WHEREAS, it appears that three-fourths of the aldermen elected are of the opinion that it would be for the best interests of the people of the City of Urbana to vacate said alley,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois hereby vacates and releases to the owners of the abutting property, all right, title and interest of the City of Urbana to the alley located and described as follows:

The alley running North and South extending from Main Street to Elm Street running midway between and parallel to Vine Street and Urbana Avenue, said alley being more specifically described as follows:


Commencing at the Northwest corner of Lot Three (3) of W. T. Webber's Subdivision to the City of Urbana, Illinois, thence West Twelve feet (12') to the Northeast corner of Lot Two (2) of said subdivision, thence South to the Southeast corner of Lot Eight (8) of said subdivision, thence East Twelve feet (12') to the Southwest corner of Lot Six (6) of said subdivision, thence North to the place of beginning, all situated in the City of Urbana, in the County of Champaign and State of Illinois.

SECTION 2. The City of Urbana, Illinois hereby reserves an easement or right-of-way upon or under the ground in said alley to be used for

public utility service and for the installation of sewers and drains.


SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.


