AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 12 OF
THE CODE OF URBANA, ILLINOIS OF 1954

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:
That Article II (Storage of Combustibles) of Chapter 12 of the Code of
the City of Urbana, Illinois of 1954 is hereby amended by adding the
following sections 12.10, 12.11 and 12.12 thereto:

Sec. 12.10. Further Regulations Concerning Liquefied Petroleum Gases.

All materials or matter composed predominately of propane, propylene,
butane, iso-butane or butylene, or any mixture of them, shall be classified
as liquefied petroleum gases and shall not be stored in the City of Urbana
except in compliance with the standards prescribed in National Board of
Fire Underwriters Pamphlet No. 58.


Sec. 12.11. Permit for Storage of Liquefied Gases in Fire Zone.

or tank of capacity in excess of 200 lbs. to be used for storage or
No equipment/for the utilization of liquefied petroleum gas shall be
installed within any fire zone of the City of Urbana unless a permit therefor
shall have first been secured. When such installation is in a building being
newly constructed or remodeled in accordance with a permit for such construc-
tion or remodeling, no extra fee for the permit shall be required. In other
cases, application for such permit shall be made to the Commissioner of
Public Works and shall contain a description of the location, equipment and
intended use of such equipment. The fee for such permit shall be Two Dollars
(\$2.00). The Commissioner shall not grant the permit unless the proposed
installation complies with the standards set forth in National Board of Fire
Underwriters Pamphlet No. 58 and the standards, rules and regulations set
forth in said pamphlet are hereby adopted by reference. Any violation of
any of the rules, regulations or standards set out in said National Board
of Fire Underwriters Pamphlet No. 58 shall be a violation of this ordinance.

Sec. 12.12. When Dikes Necessary.


When, in the opinion of the Fire Inspector of the City of Urbana, the
slope of the ground and other conditions are such that surface containers
of liquefied petroleum gases are liable in case of rupture or overflow, to
endanger adjacent property, then each container shall be surrounded by a
dike of sufficient capacity to prevent the spreading of fire.
