AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF A STREET

WHEREAS, three-fourths of all the Aldermen of the City of Urbana, Illinois, authorized to be elected by law, have determined that the public interest will be subserved by vacating the following described portion of a street.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

THE City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois hereby vacates the portion of a street described and bounded as follows, to-wit:

The portion of Mills Drive that is South of the South line of Elliot Drive and between lots 53 and 54 of Ennis Ridge First (1) Subdivision in Champaign County, Illinois, situated in the City of Urbana, and State of Illinois.

And the title of the land included within said portion of a street so vacated shall herewith vest in the then owners of the property abutting on said portion of a street.

And, the City Council and corporate authorities of said City herewith determine that the relief to the public from further burden and responsibility and maintenance of said portion of a street, and payments made by the owners heretofore for the payments of fees to record this ordinance, constitute a public interest to authorize this vacation of this portion of a street and constitutes adequate compensation for the same, and, however;

The City of Urbana, Illinois, hereby reserves the easements upon and under said portion of a street for the maintenance and repair of all sewers and drains and all public service facilities which are located on or under the surface of any part of said portion of a street, and such vacation and use of the vacated portion of a street shall create an obligation on the part of the abutting owners to re-imburse the City of Urbana for any damages caused to the said sewers and drains resulting from their conduct or use of said portion of said street, and, however;

Vesting of title in the portion of the street so vacated in the abutting property owners, shall be subject to an easement to all public utilities, their successors, and assigns to operate, maintain, and renew and reconstruct, their facilities affected by this vacation as now operated and maintained in, over, or under, the portion

of the street vacated, unless the said abutting property owners should compensate the said public utilities for such reasonable expense as shall be incurred by said public utilities in connection with the re-arrangement, removal, or relocation of said utilities, the corporate authorities having determined that it is both necessary and desirable for the public interest that the public service of all said public utilities be continued by means of said facilities.
