ORDINANCE FOR TAX REFERENDUM TO THE  
ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF URBANA,  
ILLINOIS, AT THE CITY GENERAL ELECTION  
ON APRIL 2nd, 1963, ON PROPOSITIONS OF  
THE INCREASE OF THE MAXIMUM TAX RATES  
FOR POLICE PROTECTION, FIRE PROTECTION,  
AND GENERAL CORPORATE PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA,  
ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be submitted to the voters of the  
City of Urbana, Illinois, at a special election, which is hereby  
called to be held in and for said City on the 2nd day of April,  
1963, the following propositions:

1. "Shall the maximum tax rate for the tax for police  
protection purposes of the City of Urbana, Illinois,  
be established at .15 per cent on full, fair cash  
value instead of .075 per cent, the maximum rate  
otherwise applicable to ~~the~~ the next taxes to be  
extended?"
2. "Shall the maximum tax rate for the tax for fire  
protection purposes of the City of Urbana, Illinois,  
be established at .20 per cent on full, fair cash  
value instead of .045 per cent, the maximum rate  
otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended?"
3. "Shall the maximum tax rate for the tax for general  
corporate purposes of the City of Urbana, Illinois,  
be established at .240 per cent on full, fair cash  
value instead of .1481 per cent, the maximum rate  
otherwise applicable to the next rates to be extended?"

The said propositions as described in this Section shall be  
submitted to the voters of the City of Urbana at a special election  
to be held on the 2nd day of April, 1963, the same day that the  
regular general city election for the City is to be held.

Section 2. Notice of said election shall be published in  
the Champaign-Urbana Courier, a newspaper of general circulation in  
said City, said publication to be not more than thirty nor less than  
twenty days prior to the date of said election, and that said notice  
shall be in substantially the following form:

"NOTICE OF ELECTION

Public notice is hereby given that on the 2nd day of April, 1963, a special election will be held in and for the City of Urbana, Champaign County, Illinois, at which election there will be submitted to the voters of said City the following propositions:

"Shall the maximum tax rate for the tax for police protection purposes of the City of Urbana, Illinois, be established at .15 per cent on full, fair cash value instead of .075 per cent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended?"

The approximate amount extendable under the proposed rate of .15 per cent is \$91,814.02, and the approximate amount extendable under the rate of .075 per cent, otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended, is \$45,907.01; such amounts being computed upon the last known full, fair cash value.

"Shall the maximum tax rate for the tax for fire protection purposes of the City of Urbana, Illinois, be established at .20 per cent on full, fair cash value instead of .045 per cent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended?"

The approximate amount extendable under the proposed rate of .20 per cent is \$122,418.69 and the approximate amount extendable under the rate of .045 per cent, otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended, is \$27,544.21; such amounts being computed upon the last known full, fair cash value.

"Shall the maximum tax rate for the tax for general corporate purposes of the City of Urbana, Illinois, be established at .240 per cent on full, fair cash value instead of .1481 per cent, the maximum rate otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended?"

The approximate amount extendable under the proposed rate of .240 per cent is \$146,902.43 and the approximate amount extendable under the rate of .1481 per cent, otherwise applicable to the next taxes to be extended, is \$90,651.04; such amounts being computed upon the last known full, fair cash value.

Said election shall be held in the several wards, the election precincts, heretofore established for all City elections, said election wards, the precincts, and polling places for each are as follows:

Seventh Ward	1002 South Race Street, Urbana High School

The polls shall be open from 6 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. on said April 2nd, 1963. All persons qualified to vote at any general municipal election of the City of Urbana, Illinois, are qualified to vote on these propositions, and the electors must vote at the polling place designated for the election ward, the precinct, within which they reside.


Section 4. The polling places for said election shall be those designated to be used in the general election of April 2nd, 1963, and the same Judges shall be designated as election officials for this special election as may be designated to conduct the regular general city election.

Section 5. The City Clerk of the City of Urbana is hereby directed to prepare all necessary instructions to voters, specimen ballots, and to cause the notice of election to be published as herein provided, and to take all steps required by law to conduct properly said election. Specimen ballots shall be published according to law.

Section 6. After said election, the returns thereof shall be filed with the City Clerk of said City.

Section 7. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.
