## AN ORDINANCE VACATING AN ALLEY

\*\*\*\*\*\*

WHEREAS, three-fourths of all of the aldermen of the City of Urbana,

Illinois, authorized by law to be elected, have determined that the public interests

will be subserved by vacating a certain portion of Crane Alley as hereinafter set

forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

The City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois hereby vacates Crane Alley, being an alley between Race and Broadway Streets in Urbana, Illinois, described and bounded as follows:

Commencing at a point where the West line of Crane Alley intersects with the South line of High Street in the City of Urbana, Illinois, thence South on the West line of Crane Alley to the North line of Illinois Street, thence East on the North line of Illinois Street extended to the East line of said Crane Alley, thence North on the East line of Crane Alley to the South line of High Street, thence West on the South line of High Street extended to the point of beginning, situated in the City of Urbana, County of Champaign, State of Illinois.

The title to the land included within the portion of said alley so vacated shall vest in the then owners of the property abutting on said portion of said alley.

The City of Urbana, Illinois hereby reserves easements upon and under said portion of said alley for the maintenance and repair of all sewers and drains and all public service facilities which are located on or under the surface of any part of said portion of said alley.

The vesting of title in the portion of said alley shall be subject to any easement, or easements, for public utilities, their successors and assigns, to operate, maintain, renew and reconstruct their facilities, and as are now operated and maintained in, over or under any portions of said alley so vacated, unless the said abutting property owner should compensate the said public utilities or owners for such reasonable expense as shall be incurred by said public utilities in connection with the rearrangement, removal or relocation of said utilities, this corporate

authority having determined that it is both necessary and desirable for the public interests that the public services of all of said public utilities be continued by the means of said facilities, if any are so located therein.

Adopted by the affirmative vote of at least three-fourths of all aldermen authorized by law to be elected, this 15th day of April, 1963.
