

ORDINANCE IN REGARD TO REPEAL OF SECTION 30.57 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, 1954, IN REFERENCE TO MOVING OF BUILDINGS AND WIDTH OF STREETS.

WHEREAS, the provisions of the ordinance that appears in Section 30.57 of the Code of the City of Urbana, Illinois, of 1954, were necessary when those provisions of the ordinance were adopted and for several subsequent years. More recent methods of moving of buildings on guided rubber tired dollies for protection of trees, shrubs, curbs and other objects along the streets makes the provisions of the ordinance unnecessary, obsolete and unreasonable, and since a permit must be obtained, and Section 30.56 and other provisions of the Code are for the protection of trees and other objects along the way.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

That Section 30.57, Width of Streets, Article V, Moving of Buildings, Chapter 30, Streets and Sidewalks, of the Code of the City of Urbana, Illinois, of 1954, which provided as follows:

"No building shall be moved on any street in the City unless the width of such street from curb to curb shall exceed the width of the building which is being moved by at least four feet."

is hereby repealed.
