

A TEMPORARY ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE
CITY CODE OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, 1954

Whereas, a need is recognized for regulating advertising signs in the City of Urbana, Illinois, and whereas development of provisions for such regulation is underway but not completed, and because increased construction of signs is likely to be attempted in the city before the regulations are prepared, to avoid excessive construction of signs which may later be considered unacceptable, and until such time as the City shall adopt a revised zoning and/or sign ordinance, an interim sign control ordinance regulating the dimensions of free-standing signs is desirable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA: ILLINOIS:


That Chapter 3 of the Urbana City Code, 1954, be amended by adding Section 3.11, as follows:

No free-standing sign shall be erected within the City which is higher at its topmost edge than 28 feet above curb level, nor larger in area than 56 square feet. Where a sign has two parallel faces, back-to-back, the area of each face may be up to 56 square feet. For signs constructed with more faces or with a cylindrical or other shape, the total sign area shall not exceed 56 square feet.


All additional existing requirements of the City Code regarding Advertising in the City of Urbana shall remain in effect as established in the Code.

The amendment here described shall be in effect only for that period of time before the City shall adopt a revised comprehensive zoning ordinance which shall include regulation of signs, and/or a separate sign control ordinance to be incorporated permanently into the City Code.
