## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, OF 1950

WHEREAS, the City Plan Commission of the City of Urbana, Illinois, currently did conduct a public hearing pursuant to the required public notice in the City Building, at the address of 400 South Vine Street, Urbana, Illinois, to consider the hereinafter described proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance, and,

WHEREAS, said Plan Commission at said hearing heard all persons desiring to be heard either for or against said amendment, and found that such proposed amendment was desirable for the public welfare of the City of Urbana, Illinois, and that the same is not detrimental to the property owners in the vicinities, and,

WHEREAS, the City Plan Commission recommended the amendment as hereinafter described for adoption of the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, that:

> Article VI-C of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Urbana, Illinois, of 1950, and as amended, after May 1, 1963, which include provisions in regard to dormitories, is hereby repealed, and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, that:

> Article VI-C, R=5 District, Fraternities and Soroties, as in force May 1, 1963, is hereby reenacted, and,

> BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

URBANA, ILLINOIS, that:

Such Article VI-C as herewith enacted, shall include the term and dormitories in the title, following the term R-5 District, Fraternities and Sororities, such as to provide in the title, R-5 District, Fraternities, Sororities, and Dormitories, and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

URBANA, ILLINOIS, that:

Henceforth, in Article VI-C, the term 3. Dormitories is inserted following the terms 1. Fraternities, and 2. Sororities.
