

ORDINANCE NO. 7071-17

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING THE MAYOR CERTAIN EMERGENCY POWERS


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE URBANA CITY COUNCIL THAT:

1. This Ordinance shall be entitled "EMERGENCY CURFEW PROCLAIMED".
2. The term Mayor, as used herein, shall include the acting Mayor.
3. In the event of a public emergency, natural disaster, or civil disorder, to preserve law and order, and for the maintenance of safety and health of the people and for the preservation of property, the Mayor of said City is hereby authorized to issue an enforceable proclamation for a Public Curfew commensurate with the need for the same, as determined by the Mayor under the standards set forth herein below with advice or consultation with the Chief of Police of said City and/or the Public Safety Committee of the City Council.
4. The standards for the determination by the Mayor of when a State of Emergency exists shall be:
 - (a) That there are reasonable grounds to believe that the lives and safety of persons within the corporate limits of the City of Urbana are being endangered, and/or,
 - (b) That there are reasonable grounds to believe that property, either public or private, is being destroyed or damaged, or there are reasonable grounds to believe that such destruction or damage shall occur, and
 - (c) That the establishment of a Curfew hereunder would tend to curtail and diminish the threat of injury or destruction as set forth above.
5. The extraordinary power and authority herein authorized shall not be exercised until the Mayor makes a determination under the guide-lines hereinabove set forth, that a Public Emergency, a natural disaster or civil disorder exists, and executes, under oath, a statement setting forth facts to substantiate such findings, describing the nature of the emergency and declaring that a State of Emergency exists. Such statement shall be filed with the City Clerk as soon as practicable.
6. Any public curfew declared by the Mayor under the provision of this Ordinance shall expire no later than the adjournment of the first regular meeting of the City Council after the State of Emergency is declared.

7. No person, during the existence of the Public Curfew, herein authorized, shall violate the same by remaining upon the streets, public ways, or any public property during its existence and whoever violates any provision of said Curfew shall be fined in accordance with Section 1.6 of the City Code.


This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor.
