## ORDINANCE NO. 7071-34

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of June, 1970, the City Council of Urbana, Illinois, passed an Ordinance No. 70-71-16, wherein it was ordained that the remains of all persons interred in an area of approximately 120' by 120' located on East Washington Street, in the City of Urbana, be removed to a suitable place in an existing cemetery near the City of Urbana, Illinois, and

WHEREAS, it appears likely that the number of burials originally made in said area is considerably greater than was originally known, and

WHEREAS, only a portion of said burials are located within the right-of-way of East Washington Street and within the area required by School District No. 116, County of Champaign, State of Illinois, for their construction of a new junior high school, and

WHEREAS, many of said graves are shallow and easily subject to vandalism, and WHEREAS, there is a suitable location on the same said tract of land owned by School District No. 116 for the re-interment of said remains which said place will be landscaped and not subject to any further construction,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Urbana, Illinois, that good cause exists why the remains of certain of the persons burled in said cemetery should be removed, said good cause being the facts hereinabove set forth as well as the facts set forth in said Ordinance No. 70-71-16 and that the remains of such persons as shall reasonably be required to be removed for the construction of East Washington Street and said new junior high school, and to protect against vandalism shall be removed to a suitable place on the same tract of land and re-interred at the proper depth and in concrete boxes to provide protection against vandalism and that all matters heretofore ordained by the City Council in Ordinance No. 70-71-16 not in conflict herewith remain in full force and effect.
