

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE URBANA ZONING ORDINANCE  
TO MODIFY THE OFF-STREET PARKING PROVISIONS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,  
THAT:


Section 1. All of Section 34.51, Subsection A, is repealed upon the taking effect of this Amendment.

Section 2. A new Section 34.51, Subsection A, is herewith enacted in its place, which new subsection shall read as follows:


LOCATION: Off-street parking spaces open to the sky, may be located in any yard except a required front yard and a required side yard; enclosed off-street parking spaces shall be located only in a rear yard, or under any building.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1 - 2 - 4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE URBANA ZONING ORDINANCE  
TO MODIFY THE OFF-STREET PARKING PROVISIONS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,  
THAT:

Section 1. All of Section 34.51, Subsection A, is repealed upon the taking effect of this Amendment.

Section 2. A new Section 34.51, Subsection A, is herewith enacted in its place which new subsection shall read as follows:

LOCATION: Off-street parking spaces open to the sky, may be located in any yard except a required front yard and a required side yard adjoining a street; enclosed off-street parking spaces shall be located only in a rear yard, or under any building.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1 - 2 - 4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.
