ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, FOR STREET AND BRIDGE PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF CUNNINGHAM, CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS

FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING MAY 1, 1972 AND ENDING APRIL 30, 1973,

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana, Illinois, includes wholly within its corporate limits the Town of Cunningham, and therefore, comes within the provisions of Sections 11-81-1 and 11-81-2 of Chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Illinois, for the levying of a street and bridge tax,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

That for the Fiscal Year commencing May 1, 1972, and ending April 30, 1973, there be and is hereby appropriated for street and bridge purposes in the Town of Cunningham, Champaign County, Illinois, the sum of \$149,000.00, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 11-81-1 and 11-81-2 of Chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Illinois:

That the total appropriation of \$149,000.00 be and is in addition to all other funds appropriated by the City of Urbana for general corporate purposes and provided in Sections 8-1-2 and 8-2-9 of Chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Illinois, and shall be expended as follows:
