

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE CLOSING CERTAIN
PORTIONS OF COURTESY ROAD IN URBANA, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the original Ordinance closing portions of Courtesy Road, passed October 21, 1968, is ambiguous regarding the western most limit affected, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Urbana, Illinois, is desirous of defining the limits wherein Courtesy Road is to be closed.

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED by the City Council of Urbana, Illinois, that: Courtesy Road shall be closed to all vehicular traffic between Vine and Maple Streets and Courtesy Road between the west right-of-way line of Vine Street and a parallel line running through a point which is 207.05 feet westerly along the south right-of-way line of Courtesy Road from the intersection of the west right-of-way line of Vine Street and the south right-of-way line of Courtesy Road. At the west end of the closed street, a barricade to prevent all vehicular traffic will be erected by the City of Urbana.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 18th day of September, 1972.


