

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 16.15
OF THE URBANA CITY CODE

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Illinois enacted House Bill 205 and such was approved on November 8, 1971, by the Governor, which Bill amended Section 17-27 of the "Election Code" to eliminate the provisions of State law relating to the prohibition of the sale of liquor on election day, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Illinois enacted House Bill 206 (P.A. 77-1844) and such was approved by the Governor on June 2, 1972, which Bill amended Section 10 of Article VI of an Act relating to alcoholic liquors to eliminate the provisions of that Section prohibiting the sale of liquor on election day, such Act becoming effective October 1, 1972.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,

that:

Section 1. Section 16.15 of the Urbana City Code, which reads as follows:

"Sec. 16.15. Sale on election days.


It shall be unlawful for any person to sell any alcoholic liquors in this city on the day of any national, state, county or municipal election including primary elections, during the hours the polls are open within the city or within the political area in which the political election is held."

IS HEREBY REPEALED IN ITS ENTIRETY.

Section 2. This repealing ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage by the City Council and the approval by the Mayor.


