

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE URBANA  
CITY CODE RELATING TO DOGS

---

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, that:

Section 1. All of Section 5.6 of the Urbana City Code is hereby repealed.

Section 2. Section 5.8 of the Urbana City Code is hereby repealed and  
in its place a new Section is enacted which reads as follows:

"Sec. 5.8. Procedure as to dog which has bitten a human being.

It shall be the duty of the owner or person having custody of any dog which bites any human being to keep such dog locked up in an enclosure for ten (10) days following the time the dog has bitten the person and to have the dog examined by a physician or licensed veterinarian at the commencement and termination of this ten (10) day period. If such dog during this period shall die or show definite signs of illness, it shall be the duty of such owner or person having custody of the dog to turn the dog over to the health officer or police department of the city so that it can be determined whether or not the dog has rabies. Any person violating the provision of this Section shall be subject to the penalty set out in Section 1.6 of this Code."

Section 3. Section 5.10 (4) is hereby repealed and in its place is  
enacted the following:

"(4) Is found without current tag indicating inoculation against rabies,  
or".

Section 4. Section 5.11 is hereby repealed and in its place a new  
Section is enacted which reads as follows:

"Sec. 5.11. Disposition of impounded dogs.

Any dog impounded as provided in this article may be redeemed by the owner or keeper of such dog upon payment of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per day to the municipal collector of the city for the care and feeding of such dog for each day or part of a day that it has been impounded. In case of any dog so impounded which has not been vaccinated against rabies, the impounder shall notify the County Rabies Control; giving the name and address of the owner. Any dog impounded as provided in this article not redeemed within seven days after being impounded shall be disposed of in a manner consistent with the laws of the state.

Any owner of a dog which is a public nuisance is guilty of maintaining a public nuisance, or if any owner of a dog allows such dog to be subject to impounding under section 5.10 of this Code, then such owner of such dog is in violation of this section and shall be fined five dollars (\$5.00) for the first violation, twenty dollars (\$20.00) for the second violation, and between twenty dollars (\$20.00) and two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for each additional violation."

Section 5. Section 5.12 is hereby repealed and in its place a new



Section is enacted which reads as follows:

"Sec. 5.12. Bitches in heat.

Any bitch running at large while in heat is hereby declared a nuisance. Any owner or keeper of such bitch, who permits the same to run at large when in heat shall be subject to the penalty set out in Section 1.6 of this Code."

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1972.

This Ordinance shall be effective ten days after its passage and publication as provided by law.

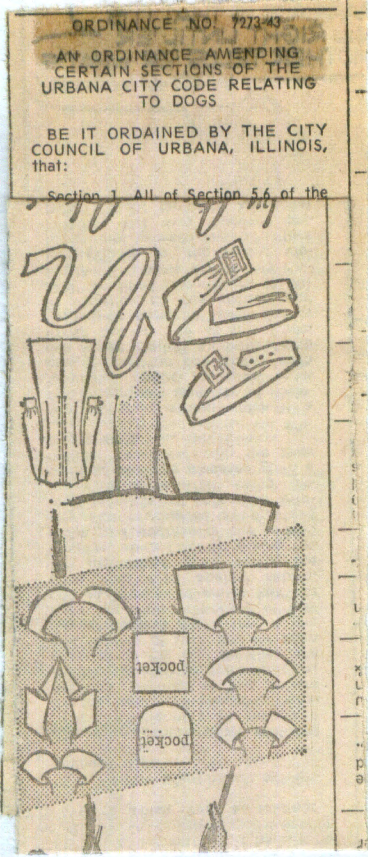
