AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING VEHICULAR TRAFFIC ON "BAKERS LANE"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,

that:

Section 1. It shall be a violation of this Ordinance for any person to drive or operate any motor vehicle, as defined in the Urbana City Code, upon the following described property, commonly known as "Bakers Lane" or "Smith Lane":

That portion of the following described parcels which lies between the South line of the right-of-way of Main Street and the North line of the right-of-way of Washington Street.

(a) Parcel 1.

A strip of ground 8 feet wide bounded as follows: Commencing at the Northwest corner of the East Half of the Northwest Quarter of Section 15, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence South following the West line of the said East Half of the Northwest Quarter, 200 feet; thence East 8 feet; thence North 200 feet thence due west 8 feet to the place of beginning.

(b) Parcel 2.

A strip of ground 16 1/2 feet wide commencing at a point 200 feet South of the Northwest corner of the East Half of the Northwest Quarter of Section 15, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence following the West boundary line of the East Half of the Northwest Quarter of Section 15, 271 feet; thence due East 16 1/2 feet, thence due North 271 feet; thence West 16 1/2 feet to the place of beginning.

(c) Parcel 3.

Section 2. Any person who shall be found guilty of violating this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$200.00 for each such offense.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall not apply to City maintenance vehicles nor to vehicles operated by the Police or Fire Departments in the course of

their duties.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1 – 2 – 4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 20 11 day of November, 1972.
