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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,

Section 1. The Zoning Ordinance of Urbana, Illinois, is hereby amended to enact the following, to-wit:

### **SECTION 34.30**

that:

- A. Lots having a frontage on each of two (2) intersecting streets and on one (1) or more other streets shall have the required front yard on each street, and shall have the visibility triangle, specified in Section 34.30B, at each intersection of two (2) or more streets.
- B. Where a lot is located at the intersection of two (2) or more streets, no building shall be built within a triangular area having as vertices the following three (3) points: the point of intersection of the center lines of the two (2) intersecting streets, and, measured from the point of intersection of the two street center lines, the point on each centerline located, in the direction of the subject property, a distance of seventy-five (75) feet plus one-half of the width of the other street measured at a point one hundred (100) feet in the direction of the subject property, from the point of intersection of the two (2) street center lines. But in no case shall the front yard on either street be less than twenty (20) feet. No accessory building shall project into the front yard on either street. Within the same triangle nothing shall be constructed, erected, placed, planted, or allowed to grow in such a manner as materially to impede vision between a height of two and one-half (2 1/2) feet and ten (10) feet above the centerline grade of the intersecting street.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1 – 2 – 4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.
