<u>Dwelling</u>: Any building, but not a travel trailer, which is exclusively designed for or used for one (1) or more dwelling units.

<u>Dwelling Unit:</u> One (1) room or a suite of rooms in a building and designed for or used by one (1) family for living and sleeping purposes.

<u>Dwelling</u>, <u>Single-Family</u>: A building designed for or occupied exclusively by one (1) family.

<u>Dwelling</u>, <u>Two-Family</u>: A building designed for or occupied exclusively by two (2) families.

<u>Dwelling</u>, <u>Duplex</u>: A building having accommodations for but two (2) families, designed for or occupied by one (1) family on each side of a party wall.

<u>Dwelling</u>, <u>Multiple</u>: A building designed for or occupied exclusively by more than two (2) families.

Family: an individual or group of two (2) or more persons related by blood, marriage, or adoption, together with not more than three (3) additional persons not related by blood, marriage, or adoption, living together as a single housekeeping unit in a dwelling unit, or a husband and wife together with not more than six (6) minor children operating as a foster family home or group home which is licensed by the State of Illinois.

Filling Station: Any building or premises used for the dispensing, sale or offering for sale at retail of automobile fuels or oil. When the dispensing, sale or offering for sale is incidental to the conduct of a public garage, the premises are classified as a public garage.'

Garage, Private: Any accessory building housing or designed to house motor-driven vehicles which are the property of, and for the use of, the occupants of the lot on which the garage is located. This term shall include, but not be limited to, such structures as
