

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING A CERTAIN ORDINANCE
ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE IN REGARD TO LENGTH
OF SERVICE AND REGULATIONS AND COMPENSATION OF
MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, that:

Section 1. A certain Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance In Regard To Length Of Service And Regulations And Compensation Of Municipal Employees", which was adopted by the Urbana City Council on May 1, 1967, and approved by the Mayor on the same date (hereinafter called 1967 Longevity Ordinance) is hereby amended as follows:

1. That from and after May 1, 1974, the provisions of the aforesaid 1967 Longevity Ordinance shall no longer be applicable, and in lieu thereof, shall be the following:

a) The maximum annual salaries of employees covered by the Annual Salary Ordinance shall be the base salaries as listed and established by the annual salary index plus longevity pay per the schedule below:

1) 2% of base salary as listed in the Annual Salary Index for each two years of service to a cumulative maximum of 10%.

2) Any employee at the time hereof already entitled to receive longevity pay under the Ordinance of May 1, 1967, which cumulatively totals 10% or greater prior to May 1, 1974, shall receive an additional increment of 2% on the date such employee would have received such additional increment under the Ordinance of May 1, 1967, but for each such employee there shall be paid no longevity beyond such higher rate, which is to say such employee shall be "frozen" at his or her next higher longevity rate.

2. To the extent the 1967 Longevity Ordinance is inconsistent with this Ordinance, such sections are herewith repealed.

This Ordinance shall be effective as of and from this date.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the Members of the Council

of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on
the 1 day of April, A.D. 1974.


