

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE INSTITUTION
OF EMINENT DOMAIN PROCEEDINGS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, has determined that the following described real estate, being private property, is needed, useful and advantageous to the City of Urbana, Illinois, for a public use, to-wit: additional office space for various functions of the city government of the City of Urbana, Illinois, and

WHEREAS, the compensation for the hereinafter described real estate which is sought, cannot be agreed upon by the City of Urbana and the owners of the premises, and

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana, Illinois, is empowered by the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970, and Statutes to institute eminent domain proceedings to fix the just compensation for such premises,

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, that:

Section 1. The City Attorney is hereby authorized to institute on behalf of the City of Urbana, Illinois, whatever legal steps he may deem necessary to fix the just compensation for the following described real estate:

Lot 3 and all of Lot 6, except the East 55 feet thereof, in Block 2 of George R. Webber's First Addition to Urbana, situated in the City of Urbana, in Champaign County, Illinois,

commonly known as 404-406 South Vine Street, Urbana, Illinois.

Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the Members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 18 day of September, 1974
