

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE
URBANA LOCAL TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the ultimate goal of the City Council of the City of Urbana is to require automobile owners to pay the full economic cost of the storage of their vehicles, preferably by arranging off street storage. The City Council feels that an abrupt change to this policy would cause considerable economic hardship and this amendment is intended to be a first step in the transition towards the goals stated herein, and

WHEREAS, it is intended that an amount equal to the amount of revenue raised from the sale of parking permits and the enforcement of parking regulations in this area shall be used to pay the costs of enforcement of the parking regulations in the area, and

WHEREAS, it is intended that if new parking problems are created in this area or adjacent areas due to the enforcement of this Ordinance or to the causes which prompted it, said problems will be attacked by extending or modifying these regulations, and

WHEREAS, it is further intended that if severe hardship is caused to classes of persons with legitimate interests not in conflict with the intent of this Ordinance, the City Council may add certain additional rules or exceptions to alleviate these hardships.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, that the URBANA LOCAL TRAFFIC ORDINANCE is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. A new Section 14.13 is created to read:

"Section 14.13.

(a) On each street in the area bounded by (but not including) Green and Race Streets, Lincoln and Florida Avenue, parking on that side of the street where parking is not prohibited at all times shall be prohibited between 3:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M., except for those vehicles displaying a valid permit issued pursuant to subsection (b) below. The foregoing parking prohibitions of this subsection shall not be operative on Saturdays, Sundays, or City legal holidays.

(b) Special parking permits shall be issued each year for the period beginning August 15 (and ending August 14 of the following year). These permits shall be sold for one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

The permits shall be numbered and each numbered permit shall be issued for use on a specific automobile. The display of said permit on any other automobile shall be of no effect on the illegal parked status of that automobile. If the owner of a permit replaces his or her automobile, a new permit shall be issued upon evidence that the old permit has been destroyed.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 14.3 of the Urbana Local Traffic Ordinance, parking shall be prohibited at all times on the following portions of the streets described below and Schedule IX is hereby amended accordingly:

- (a) The East side of Busey Street from Green Street to Florida Avenue.
- (b) The East side of Coler Street from Green Street to Florida Avenue.
- (c) The East side of Orchard Street from Green Street to Florida Avenue.
- (d) The East side of McCullough Street from Green Street to Washington Street.
- (e) The East side of Douglas Street from Iowa Street to Indiana Street.
- (f) The East side of Carle Avenue from Indiana Street to Florida Avenue.
- (g) The East side of Birch Street from Green Street to Washington Street.
- (h) The East side of Garfield Street from Iowa Street to Indiana Street.
- (i) The East side of Cedar Street from Green Street to Washington Street.
- (j) The North side of High Street from Busey Street to Race Street.
- (k) The North side of Illinois Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.
- (l) The North side of California Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.
- (m) The North side of Oregon Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.
- (n) The North side of Nevada Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.
- (o) The North side of Washington Street from Busey Street to Race Street.
- (p) The North side of Iowa Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.
- (q) The North side of Ohio Street from Lincoln Avenue to Orchard Street.
- (r) The North side of Indiana Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.

(s) The North side of Michigan Avenue from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.

(t) The North side of Pennsylvania Avenue from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.

(u) The North side of Vermont Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.

(v) The North side of Delaware Street from Lincoln Avenue to Race Street.

Section 3. The Director of Public Works is authorized and directed to erect the appropriate signs, giving notice of this Ordinance upon the right-of-way in the area.

Section 4. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of such provision to any circumstance is held invalid for any reason whatsoever, the remainder of this Ordinance or the application of the provision to other circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 5. All Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall be effective at 12:01 A.M. on August 15, 1975, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the Members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on this 15th day of May, 1975.

BEFORE DATED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, that the URBANA LOCAL TRAFFIC ORDINANCE be amended as follows:
SECTION 14.13 is

in the area (including) Green and Florida Avenue, the east side of the street is not prohibited between 7:00 A.M. except for a valid parking permit. The subsection regarding parking prohibition shall not be on Sundays, or

permits shall be issued for the period beginning August 1 and ending August 14 of the following year. These permits shall be sold for one hundred dollars (100.00).

The permits shall be numbered and each numbered permit shall be issued for use on a specific automobile. The display of said permit on any other automobile shall be of no effect on the illegal parked status of that automobile. If the owner of a permit replaces his or her automobile, a new permit shall be issued upon evidence that the old permit has been destroyed.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 14.3 of the Urbana Local Traffic Ordinance, parking shall be prohibited at all times on the following portions of the streets
