

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14 OF
THE URBANA CITY CODE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,

that:

"Sanitary Haulers"

Section 1. License Required.

a) It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the removal of offal, garbage, slops or the like, or pursue the occupation for hire or fee, of sanitary hauler in the City, without first having obtained from the Municipal Collector a license to do so.

b) The annual license fee for sanitary haulers is as set forth in the Schedule of Fees (Chapter 18), and such license shall expire on June 30, each year, unless renewed by advance annual payment of the license fee.

Section 2. Equipment Requirements.

a) A license shall not be granted unless the applicant for the same shall have and own proper and necessary vehicles, machinery and appliances for transporting and disposing of garbage in conformity with the provisions of this code, and with all applicable traffic, health and sanitary ordinances, statutes, regulations or rules of the State of Illinois, County of Champaign, Illinois, and the City of Urbana, Illinois.

b) All vehicles used in the collection of garbage shall conform to the following requirements:

1. Vehicles shall at all times be kept in a neat, clean and sanitary condition, and further, must be emptied at the end of each collection day and must be thoroughly cleaned so that they will give off no offensive or obnoxious odors.

2. Vehicles shall be equipped with a watertight bed and tightly fitted with covers, and be so constructed that no portion of the garbage conveyed therein shall be scattered or left in or upon any sidewalk, street or alley of the City.

3. The bed of any vehicle used for hauling garbage from without the limits of the City of Urbana into and over the streets of said City, must comply with the regulations in this Ordinance.

"Rubble and Miscellaneous Refuse Hauling"

Section 3. Operating and Equipment Requirements.

All vehicles hauling any rubble, construction and demolition wastes, municipal wastes or miscellaneous residential, commercial and industrial wastes within the City of Urbana must conform to the following requirements:

a) Vehicles must be so constructed, loaded and operated so as to prevent any of the load from dropping, sifting, leaking or otherwise escaping therefrom except for those vehicles and materials used in the maintenance of city streets and alleys.

b) More specifically, any vehicle hauling materials that may be blown from the bed must have said material covered at all times with a screen, tarpaulin or suitable cover so as to prevent blowing.

"Urbana Sanitary Landfill"

Section 4. Use of the Sanitary Landfill.

a) Any person using the Sanitary Landfill for solid waste disposal shall pay to the City One Dollar (1.00) for each cubic yard of material deposited at the Sanitary Landfill. The Landfill Supervisor shall act as a Deputy Collector of the Municipal Collector's Office and shall make a proper accounting of all monies received to the Municipal Collector.

b) Any solid wastes delivered or transported to the Urbana Sanitary Landfill for disposal must have originated from within the City Limits or within one and one-half miles outside the City Limits and not from the City of Champaign, Illinois, and otherwise east of Wright Street and Wright Street extended. This subsection does not apply to material covered by special contract.

c) Sanitary haulers hauling from that area outside the City Limits but within one and one-half miles outside the City Limits must obtain a license from the Municipal Collector's Office, and pay the fees set forth in Chapter 18, and shall send reports as required by the City and shall pay monthly in advance the sum of one (\$1.00) dollar per nonresident customer, and the hauler shall charge every such customer the same fee accordingly, in addition

to the rates for residential hauls generally from inside the City. In the case of multiple family dwellings, the charge shall be one (\$1.00) dollar per family residential unit per month. No garbage, trash or other materials shall be hauled from outside the City to the City Landfill from any commercial or industrial establishment outside the City Limits, unless there is a contractual arrangement in this regard between the hauler and the City. The Director of Public Works of the City Council shall determine what uses are residential, commercial or industrial. Haulers can ascertain from month to month from the City the extent of the City Limits.

d) All vehicles hauling solid waste for disposal to the Urbana Sanitary Landfill must conform to the vehicle requirements of Sections 2 and 3 of this Ordinance.

Section 5. Monthly Billing System.

Persons desiring to use the Urbana Landfill disposal facility under the monthly billing system must register with the Municipal Collector's Office. The Municipal Collector's Office shall furnish to the Landfill Supervisor a list of persons or firms which may charge disposal fees.

Charges and fees will be billed to the registered user by the Municipal Collector's Office at the end of each month based on the disposal rates set forth above as tabulated by the Landfill Supervisor.

Section 6. Disposition of Wastes.

All garbage, trash, and other materials dumped or deposited at the Sanitary Landfill shall be dumped or deposited only pursuant to the directions of City employees.

Section 7. Landfill Rules and Regulations.

The City Council may, from time to time, adopt rules concerning the operation of the Urbana Sanitary Landfill and any violation of any rule so adopted shall be considered a violation of this Section and shall, if the violator is a licensed sanitary hauler, subject the violator to suspension or revocation of his license.

Section 8. Penalty.

Any person violating any provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$200.00. In addition to such fine, if any, if the person violating any provisions of this Ordinance holds a license or permit issued by the City of Urbana, such license or permit may be suspended or revoked.

Section 9. Upon the taking effect of this amendatory Ordinance, all sections contained in Articles II and III of Chapter 14 are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the Members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 21 day of July, 1975.
