

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING  
THE ANNUAL BUDGET ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1975, and ending June 30, 1976, has been duly adopted according to law and ordinance; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend said budget to provide for expenditure of certain budgeted funds for the specific purposes hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, funds are available for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, the amendments set forth herein are not such revisions as can be made by the Budget Director under Section 6 of the said Ordinance:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That the annual budget ordinance for the fiscal year 1975-1976 heretofore adopted by this Council be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

That the \$40,000 for social services and planning is hereby allocated as follows:

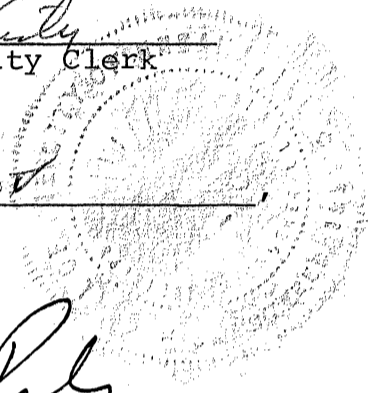
