

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SALE TO AND
POSSESSION OF BEER AND WINE BY PERSONS OF
THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN YEARS AND OLDER

WHEREAS, the CITY OF URBANA, is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970, and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is intended as, and is in the exercise of, certain powers and functions pertaining to the government and affairs of the CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS,

BE IT ORDAINED that Chapter 43, of the Ill. Rev. Stats. 1973, Section 131 thereof shall be of no force or effect within the corporate limits of the City of Urbana, and in its stead and in its place is hereby enacted the following:

No licensee nor any officer, associate, member, representative, agent or employee of such licensee shall sell, give or deliver alcoholic liquor to any person under the age of 21 years, or in the case of beer and wine, under the age of 18 years, or to any intoxicated person or to any person known by him to be an habitual drunkard, spendthrift, insane, mentally ill, mentally deficient or in need of mental treatment. No person, after purchasing or otherwise obtaining alcoholic liquor, shall sell, give or deliver such alcoholic liquor to another person under the age of 21 years or in the case of beer and wine under the age of 18 years, except in the performance of a religious ceremony or service.

For the purpose of preventing the violation of this section, any licensee, or his agent or employee, may refuse to sell or serve alcoholic beverages to any person who is unable to produce adequate written evidence of identity and of the fact that he or she is over the age of 21 years, or, in the case of beer or wine, over the age of 18 years.

Adequate written evidence of age and identity of the person is a document issued by a federal, state, county, or municipal government, or subdivision or agency thereof, including, but not limited to, a motor vehicle operator's license, a registration certificate issued under the Federal Selective Service Act, or an identification card issued to a member of the Armed Forces. Proof that the defendant-licensee, or his employee or agent, demanded, was shown and reasonably relied upon such written evidence in any

transaction, forbidden by this Section is competent evidence and may be considered in any criminal prosecution therefore or to any proceedings for the suspension or revocation of any license based thereon.

Any person who sells, gives, or furnishes to any person under the age of 21 years any false or fraudulent written, printed, or photostatic evidence of the age and identity of such person or who sells, gives or furnishes to any person under the age of 21 years evidence of age and identification of any other person to shall be guilty of violating this ordinance.

Any person under the age of 21 years, or, in the case of beer and wine, under the age of 18 years, who presents or offers to any licensee, his agent or employee, any written, printed or photostatic evidence of age and identity which is false, fraudulent, or not actually his own for the purpose of ordering, purchasing, attempting to purchase or otherwise procuring or attempting to procure, the serving of any alcoholic beverage, or who has in his possession any false or fraudulent written, printed, or photostatic evidence of age and identity, is guilty of violating this ordinance.

Any person under the age of 21 years, in the case of beer or wine, under the age of 18 years, who has any alcoholic beverage in his possession on any street or highway, or in any public place or in any place open to the public is guilty of violating this ordinance. Provided however this section does not apply to possession by a person under the age of 21 years, or in the case of beer and wine, under the age of 18 years, making a delivery of an alcoholic beverage in pursuance of the order of his parent or in pursuance of his employment.

Any person found guilty of violating any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not in excess of \$200.00.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the Members

of the Council of the City of Urbana, at a regular meeting of
said Council on the 3RD day of November, 1975.
