AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CITY OF URBANA SPECIAL SERVICE AREA NUMBER TWO

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Champaign County, Illinois, as follows:

Area Number Two is established pursuant to the provisions of Article 7, Sections 6A and 6L of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and pursuant to: an Act to provide the manner of levying or imposing taxes for the provision of Special Services to areas within the boundaries of home rule units and non-home rule municipalities and counties. (Sections 1301 through 1311 inclusive of Chapter 120, Ill. Rev. Stat. 1975 as amended).

SECTION 2. Findings. A. The question of the establishment of the area hereinafter described as a Special Service Area is considered by the City Council of Urbana, Illinois, pursuant to an Ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance Proposing the Establishment of a Special Service Area in the City of Urbana and Providing for a Public Hearing and Other Procedures in Connection Therewith" passed by the City Council on the 5th day of January, 1976 and approved by the Mayor on the 9th day of January, 1976 and is considered pursuant to a hearing held on February 16, 1976 by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, pursuant to notice duly published in the Champaign-Urbana Courier, a newspaper of general circulation within the City of Urbana, Illinois, at least 15 days prior to the hearing and pursuant to notice by mail addressed to the person or persons in whose name the general taxes for the last preceding year were paid on each Lot, tract, or parcel of land within the special service area. Said notice was given by depositing said notice in the United States Mail not less than 10 days prior to the time set for public hearing. In the event taxes for the last preceding year were not paid, the said notice was sent to the person last listed on the tax rolls prior to that year as the owner of the said property. A copy of a certificate of publication of said notice and an affidavit of mailing of said notice are attached to this Ordinance as exhibits 1 and 2. Said notices conformed in all respects to the requirements of Section 1301 through 1311 inclusive of Chapter 120, Ill. Rev. Stat. 1975 as amended,

as aforesaid.

- That a public hearing on the questions set forth in the notice was held on February 16, 1976. All interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard on the question of the creation of City of Urbana Special Services Area Number Two and on the question of levying an annual tax of not to exceed an annual rate of .023 percent of the assessed value, as equalized, of the property in the special services area and the question of the tax to be levied for a maximum of ten years from the date of the ordinance and the question of borrowing \$280,700 to be evidenced by general obligation bonds, proceeds of which shall be used to pay part of the costs of construction of local improvement project 186-CS. That several persons, through their respective attorneys, filed protests and addressed the Urbana City Council concerning the method of financing the aforesaid local improvement. There were approximately twenty-five (25) persons present. The public hearing was then adjourned. Thereafter on the second day of August, 1976, the Urbana City Council adopted an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Determining All Protests And Objections To the Establishment Of Special Service Area Number Two In The City of Urbana, Champaign County, Illinois, And Providing For Final Adjournment Of The Public Hearing Thereon", which said ordinance was approved by the Mayor on the 3rd day of August, 1976, and thereafter published in the Champaign-Urbana Courier, a newspaper of general circulation within the City of Urbana, Illinois, on the 12th day of August, 1976, and in the Champaign-Urbana News Gazette, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Urbana, Illinois, on the 12th day of August, 1976, copies of the respective certificates of publication for which are attached hereto and marked as "Exhibits 3 and 4" respectively.
- C. That after considering all factors, the City
 Council finds that it is in the public interest and in the best
 interests of the City of Urbana Special Service Area Number Two
 that the said Special Service Area hereinafter described be
 established.
- D. That the said Special Service Area is compact and contiguous and constitutes the area specially benefited by the aforesaid local improvement.

SECTION 3. Special Service Area Number Two Of The City
Of Urbana, Illinois, Established.

A special service area to be known and designated as Special Service Area Number Two of the City of Urbana, Illinois, is hereby established and shall consist of the following described territory:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 75 of Fairlawn Park Sixth Addition in Section 16, Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence Southerly along the east right-of-way line of Cottage Grove Avenue across Florida Avenue to a point 412 feet south of the North line of Section 21; thence easterly along a line parallel to the North line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 21 to a point 600 feet west of the east line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 21; thence southerly along a line parallel to the east line of the North-west Quarter of Section 21 to a point 677.35 feet south of the north line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 21; thence easterly along a line parallel to the north line of the North-west Quarter of Section 21 to the east line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 21; thence along the west line of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21 to a point 660 feet from the Southwest corner of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21; thence easterly along a line parallel to the southline of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21 to a point 520 feet west of the east line of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21; thence northerly to the Southwest corner of the east 520 feet of the north 480 feet of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21; thence easterly along a line parallel to the north line of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21 to the southeast corner of the north 480 feet of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21; thence northerly along the east line of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21 to the south right-of-way line of Florida Avenue; thence easterly along the south right-of-way of Florida Avenue to the point of intersection with the eastern line extended of Lot 4 of Weller's Lincolnwood Manor; thence northerly along the eastern line extended of said Lot 4 to the Southeast corner of said Lot 4; thence northerly along the eastern line of said Lot 4 to the northeast corner of said Lot 4; thence westerly along the northern lines of Lots 4 and 1 of Weller's Lincolnwood Manor, to the northwest corner of said Lot 1; thence southerly along the western line extended of said Lot 1 to the southeast corner of Lot 12, Block 17 of Champaign-Urbana Amvets Subdivision; thence westerly along the southern line of Champaign-Urbana Amvets Subdivision to the southwest corner of Lot 5, Block 16 of Champaign-Urbana Amvets Subdivision; thence northerly along the western line of Block 16 of Champaign-Urbana Amvets Subdivision to the northwest corner of Lot 1 of said Block 16; thence westerly along the southern line extended of Block 15 of Champaign-Urbana Amvets Subdivision to a point on the east right-of-way line of Philo Road; thence southerly along the east right-of-way line of Philo Road to the point of intersection with the Northern line extended of Lot 88 of Fairlawn Park Sixth Addition;

thence westerly along the northern line extended of Lot 88 of Fairlawn Park Sixth Addition to the northwest corner of Lot 88; thence westerly along the northern lines of Lots 89, 90, 91, 92, 93, 94, 95, 96, 97 and 98 of Fairlawn Park Sixth Addition to the northwest corner of said Lot 98; thence southerly along the western line of said Lot 98 to the point of intersection with the northern line extended of Lot 67 of Fairlawn Park Sixth Addition; thence westerly along the northern line extended of said Lot 67 to the northwest corner of said Lot 67; thence westerly along the northern lines of Lots 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, and 75 of Fairlawn Park Sixth Addition to the northwest corner of said Lot 75, said corner of Lot 75 being the point of beginning.

All located in Sections 16 and 21 of Township 19 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian, Champaign County, Illinois.

a map of said territory being attached hereto as Exhibit "5".

SECTION 4. Purpose of Area.

Special Service Area Number Two Of The City of Urbana is established to pay part of the costs of construction of local improvement project 186-CS, which said local improvement project involves the improvement at the intersection of Philo Road and Florida Avenue and extending generally in each direction from The proposed improvement of Philo Road said intersection. consists of constructing a Portland Cement concrete surface forty-four feet (44') in width with a bituminous surface transition at each end. On Florida Avenue the proposed improvement consists of constructing a Portland Cement concrete surface forty-four feet (44') in width. At the intersection of these two streets, it is proposed to install a traffic control signal and along both routes it is proposed to install street lighting. Special Service Area Number Two Of The City Of Urbana is also created so that bonds may be issued, for the purpose aforesaid, payable from taxes levied on property in the Special Service Area in addition to all other taxes so levied, provided no bonds shall be issued in excess of the principal amount of \$280,700.00, or at an interest rate to exceed 7% per annum and the said bonds to mature within a ten year period from date. An annual tax not to exceed .023 per cent of the assessed value, as equalized of the property of the Special Service area, shall be levied against said property for a period not to exceed ten years.

SECTION 5. Publication.

That the City Clerk is hereby directed to cause a certified copy of this Ordinance to be published one time within ten (10) days after its adoption in the Champaign-Urbana Courier, the same being a newspaper published in and of general circulation within said City; and the City Clerk is directed to cause a certified copy of this Ordinance to be filed with the County of Champaign, State of Illinois.

SECTION 6. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect as of the 8th day of September , 1976.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the Members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 1 day of September 1976.





AN AGREEMENT RELATIVE TO SPECIAL SERVICE AREA NUMBER TWO OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS AND LOCAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT 186-CS

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into as of the # day of , 1979, by and between the CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, a Municipal Corporation of the State of Illinois, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and FIRST NATIONAL BANK IN CHAMPAIGN, as Trustee under a Trust Agreement known as Trust No. 596, FINANCIAL PROPERTIES INC., BUSEY FIRST NATIONAL BANK, as Trustee under a Trust Agreement known as Trust No. 274, CHAMPAIGN NATIONAL BANK, as Trustee under a Trust Agreement known as Trust No. 032-561-003, BUSEY FIRST NATIONAL BANK, as Trustee under a Trust Agreement known as Trust No. 1-414, BUSEY FIRST NATIONAL BANK, as Trustee under a Trust Agreement known as Trust No. 1-444, BUSEY FIRST NATIONAL BANK, as Trustee under a Trust Agreement known as Trust No. 1-555, CHAMPAIGN LOAN & BUILDING ASSOCIATION, FIRST NATIONAL BANK IN CHAMPAIGN, as Trustee under a Trust Agreement known as Trust No. 404, and DOUGLAS G. KURASEK, JERRY A. KURASEK and KEVIN MARTINDALE, and all beneficial interest holders under said trusts, and all of said parties successors and transferees, hereinafter referred to as "Property Owners".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, by

Ordinance Number 7677-25, entitled, "An Ordinance Establishing City
of Urbana Special Service Area Number Two", which said Ordinance was
passed by the City Council on the 7th day of September, 1976, and
approved by the Mayor on the 8th day of September, 1976, established
a special service area to be known and designated as Special Service
Area Number Two of the City of Urbana, Illinois, to pay part of the
costs of construction of local improvement project 186-CS, which said
local improvement project involved the improvement at the intersection
of Philo Road and Florida Avenue and extended generally in each
direction from said intersection, and other public improvements to
date which have included construction of sidewalks, streetlighting
and landscaping; and

WHEREAS, the said Special Service Area Number Two of the City of Urbana, Illinois was so established to consist of certain territory more particularly described in Exhibit A of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, The First National Bank in Champaign, a National Banking Association, as Trustee of its Trust Number 404, which is the owner of property within the boundaries of the said Special Service Area Number Two, has, on the 20th day of October, 1976, commenced an action as Plaintiff in the Circuit Court of the Sixth Judicial Circuit, Champaign County, Illinois, under Docket Number 76-C-1045, seeking, among other things, to have the said Ordinance Number 767725 declared wholly void and of no force and effect; and,

WHEREAS, The Busey First National Bank, a National Banking Association, as Trustee of its Trust Number 1-414, which is the owner of property within the boundaries of the said Special Service Area Number Two, has, on the 24th day of February, 1977, commenced an action as Plaintiff in the Circuit Court of the Sixth Judicial Circuit, Champaign County, Illinois, under Docket Number 77-C-156, seeking, among other things, to have the said Ordinance Number 7677-25declared wholly void and of no force and effect; and,

WHEREAS, included in the said Special Service Area is real estate of the Property Owners,

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the amounts hereinafter set forth and the mutual promises made to each other, the parties hereby do mutually covenant and agree as follows:

Section 1. The City agrees to refrain from levying, assessing or otherwise collecting costs of construction, or imposing any tax or assessment, related to the costs of construction of all existing public improvements except as listed on the attached Exhibit C, existing within fourteen hundred feet of the intersection of Philo Road and Florida Avenue in Urbana, Illinois, including local improvement project 186-CS, against or upon the real estate described in Exhibit B and Property Owners thereof. The acceptance by the City of the amount hereinafter set forth shall be in full compromise settlement and satisfaction of, and as sole consideration for the final release and discharge of, all actions, claims and demands whatsoever, that now exist,

or may hereafter accrue, against those said described properties in conjunction with all costs of construction of the said local improvement projects.

It is specifically recognized and agreed by and between the parties to this Agreement, however, that the City hereby reserves and does not in any manner waive any and all rights and authority that may now exist or hereafter accrue to levy, assess, or otherwise impose and collect any tax or assessment as listed on the attached Exhibit C, and in conjunction with the costs of construction of the said Local Improvement Project 186-CS upon any and all properties except those described The City agrees to indemnify and save harmless, inin Exhibit B. cluding attorney fees and costs, the real estate described in Exhibit B, and the Property Owners thereof, from and against all actions, claims and demands whatsoever, that now exist or may hereafter accrue for all public improvements located within fourteen hundred feet of the intersection of Philo Road and Florida Avenue in Urbana, Illinois, in existence as of this date, to include all costs of construction of the said Local Improvement Project 186-CS, and excepting those projects listed on the attached Exhibit C.

Section 2. Property Owners hereby agree to pay to the City, upon execution and delivery of this Agreement, the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00).

Section 3. The parties to this Agreement further recognize and agree that this Agreement shall likewise serve as an agreement of compromise and settlement to the legal actions heretofore filed in the Circuit Court, Champaign County, Illinois, under Docket Number 76-C-1045 and Docket Number 77-C-156, and that those two (2) said legal actions shall be forthwith dismissed with prejudice following the execution of this Agreement; and that all previous agreements relating to said public improvements between the parties are settled, compromised and included in this agreement.

Section 4. This instrument may be pleaded as a complete and full satisfaction and release of all claims of the City of Urbana and any party claiming through the City of Urbana against the real estate described in Exhibit B, and the Property Owners thereof, for all matters compromised and settled by the terms hereof.
