

ORDINANCE NO. 7980-108

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF BROADWAY AVENUE

WHEREAS, a proper Petition to the City of Urbana, Illinois, has been filed regarding the vacation of a portion of the City right-of-way known as Broadway Avenue, and;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, has determined that the public interest will be subserved by vacating that portion of Broadway Avenue, and;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, has determined that that portion of Broadway Avenue shall be vacated in accordance with the provisions of law.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, hereby vacates, subject to the terms set forth in this Ordinance, that portion of Broadway Avenue which is specifically described as follows:

Commencing at a point Three Feet (3') West of the intersection of the North right-of-way line of Main Street and the East right-of-way line of Broadway Avenue, thence West .2 feet, thence North parallel with the East right-of-way line of Broadway Avenue to the South right-of-way line extended of Water Street; thence East .2 Feet to a point which is Three Feet (3') West of the East right-of-way line of Broadway Avenue, thence South along and Three Feet (3') West of a line parallel to the East right-of-way line of Broadway Avenue, to the point of beginning, all located within the City of Urbana, County of Champaign, Illinois, containing 62 square feet more or less.

Section 2. The City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, finds and determines that \$10.00 is the amount of money which is equal to the benefits which will accrue to owners of the abutting properties by reason of this vacation ordinance; and this ordinance shall not be effective until payment of such sum has been made to the Clerk of the City of Urbana, Illinois.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby passed at a regular meeting of said City Council by the affirmative vote of three-fourths (3/4ths) of the aldermen and alderwomen holding office who did not abstain from voting on this Ordinance, all in accordance with the Ordinances of the City of Urbana, Illinois, heretofore adopted and in effect.

PASSED by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, this 19th day of May, 1980.
