

ORDINANCE NO. 8384-36

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A MORATORIUM  
ON THE ERECTION OF SIGNAGE AND ISSUANCE OF SIGN PERMITS

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana has heretofore on the 19th day of December, 1983, passed an Ordinance establishing a moratorium on the erection of signage and issuance of sign permits in the City of Urbana, and

WHEREAS, the City staff has now had an opportunity to study further the problem created by the recent ruling of the Champaign County Circuit Court concerning the Urbana sign regulations, and has recommended certain amendments to the aforesaid ordinance establishing a moratorium.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

That Section 1 of the aforesaid Ordinance is amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. That the City of Urbana finds it essential to declare an immediate moratorium on the issuance of sign permits and erection of signage, provided, however, this moratorium shall not apply for the erection and maintenance of commercial or non-commercial signs consistent with those standards setting forth the height, area, location, and number of signs by zoning district prescribed in Tables IX-1, IX-2, IX-3 and IX-4 of Article IX of the Amended Zoning Ordinance of 1979 upon the issuance of a temporary permit for such sign by the Zoning Administrator. Nor shall this moratorium apply to the erection of those signs allowed without a permit as prescribed in Section IX-5 of Article IX of said Ordinance."

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the Members of the Council of the

City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 6<sup>th</sup>  
day of February, 1984.

Nor shall this moratorium apply to the erection of those signs allowed without a permit as prescribed in Section IX-5 of Article IX of said Ordinance."
