

ORDINANCE NO. 8990-52

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION
TO DECERTIFY ELIGIBILITY LISTS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE URBANA CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

That Ordinance 8990-1 for and entitled "An Ordinance Relating to Civil Service" is hereby amended as provided for herein:

Section 1. The existing Paragraph 6 thereof to be designated as subsection (a) and the enacting of the following paragraph as subsection (b):

6(b)

The Civil Service Commission may strike the entire list of all names on any original entry register at any time that the Commission finds that striking all the names from such register would best promote the selection and hiring of the most qualified persons for employment by the City and the Commission sets forth in writing their reasons for such finding. No positions shall be required to be filled prior to the striking of such register.


Section 2. The provisions of Section 10-1-1 of the Illinois Municipal Code notwithstanding, Commissioners of the Urbana Civil Service Commission may hold, at the time of appointment and continue to hold, lucrative office or employment under the United States, the State of Illinois, the University of Illinois, or Parkland College.

Section 3. Section one of this Ordinance is repealed as of December 1, 1991 and shall after that date be of no force and effect, and simultaneously the then existing provisions of Chapter 24 respecting how long names of candidates must remain on the appointment register shall again be in effect.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage in accordance with the terms of Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called of a majority of the Members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 20th day of November, 1989.
