

ORDINANCE 9091-72

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-118.1 OF THE
URBANA CITY CODE (SALE OR DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL PROPERTY)

WHEREAS, state statutes provide that whenever a municipality owns any personal property which in the opinion of 3/4 of the corporate authorities then holding office is no longer necessary or useful to the City, then by Ordinance the corporate authorities may authorize the sale of that personal property in such a manner as they designate; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate authorities find and determine that it would be advantageous to the City of Urbana to provide standing authority for the disposition and sale of such property rather than enacting individual Ordinances when sufficient such personal property has accumulated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that Section 2-118.1 of the Urbana City Code is hereby repealed in its entirety and in its place is enacted the following:

"Items of personal property belonging to the City of Urbana may be sold or offered for sale to any financially responsible person by the department head of the City Department utilizing such item of personal property, provided such department head determines first that such items of personal property are no longer useful or necessary for the use of the City of Urbana or its employees and provided further that the Chief Administrative Officer finds that the manner and method of sale will achieve the highest price that can be reasonably expected to be achieved for the sale of such item."

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from its passage and recording as provided by law.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the Members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of the said Council on the 17th day of December, 1990.
