

ORDINANCE NO. 9192-35

AN ORDINANCE  
REVISING THE ANNUAL BUDGET ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget Ordinance of and for the City of Urbana, Champaign County, Illinois, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1991, and ending June 30, 1992, (the "Annual Budget Ordinance") has been duly adopted according to sections 8-2-9.1 et seq. of the Illinois Municipal Code (the "Municipal Code") and Division 2, entitled "Budget", of Article VI, entitled "Finances and Purchases", of Chapter 2, entitled "Administration," of the Code of Ordinances, City of Urbana, Illinois (the "City Code"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the said City of Urbana finds it necessary to revise said Annual Budget Ordinance by deleting and repealing certain language therefrom; and

WHEREAS, the repeal of the language as set forth below shall not affect the expenditure of funds not already provided for; and

WHEREAS, such revision is not one that may be made by the Budget Director under the authority so delegated to the Budget Director pursuant to section 8-2-9.6 of the Municipal Code and section 2-133 of the City Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That the Annual Budget Ordinance be and the same is hereby revised to:

1. Repeal of the following note, which was added to page 155 of the City of Urbana annual budget for fiscal year 1991-92, as adopted on June 3, 1991:

"In the event that vacancies occur in Engineering Department personnel during fiscal year 1991-92, expenditures for recruitment or salaries budgeted for the vacant position shall be authorized only upon passage of a Resolution by the City Council authorizing said expenditures. In such an event and in the absence of passage of such a Resolution, expenditure of only \$1,100 of the money budgeted for personnel for the vacant position is authorized."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval and shall not be published.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the corporate authorities then holding office, the "ayes" and "nays" being called at a regular meeting of said council.
