

AN ORDINANCE  
REVISING THE ANNUAL BUDGET ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the structure located on property on Springfield Avenue near Mathews, commonly known as the "Forbes House" is of important historical significance; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Forbes House must be removed from the premises where it now stands to accommodate certain building plans of the University of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the University of Illinois has donated the said structure to the Women's Emergency Shelter so that it may be relocated to a new location at 508 East Church Street, Champaign, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Women's Emergency Shelter is a not-for-profit organization which serves citizens of the entire community; and

WHEREAS, the City of Champaign has agreed to do what is necessary to accommodate the move within the City of Champaign at not cost to the Women's Emergency Shelter; and

WHEREAS, Urbana City Ordinances require the payment of approximately Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,521.02) in fees for wages for extra personnel required by the move and to move and relocate signs, street poles, etc.; and

WHEREAS, the Urbana City Council finds and determines that under the circumstances, the City of Urbana shall pay the required fees and charges on behalf of the Women's Emergency Shelter to accommodate the moving project.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

Section 1. The Annual Budget Ordinance is revised as follows:

FUND: General  
DEPARTMENT: Public Works  
ADD: REVENUE: Forbes House Move  
ADD EXPENSE: Forbes House Move (Non-recurring)  
AMOUNT: \$3,521.02

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval and shall not be published.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3rds) of the members of the Corporate Authorities then holding office, the "ayes" and "nays" being called at a regular meeting of said Council.
