## ORDINANCE NO. 9697-3

## AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN REVISIONS TO THE LIQUOR CODE AND THE FEE SCHEDULE

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE URBANA CITY COUNCIL as follows:

Section 1. That Section 3-41(c), which contains a list of the classifications of the liquor licenses available from the City of Urbana is hereby amended to read as follows:

## "(c) Adjunct Licenses.

- (1) <u>Class AA-1 licenses (additional hotel-motel license)</u>, may be issued to any hotel or motel having a valid Class AA license issued by the city and shall authorize the sale of alcoholic liquors at one additional permanent location in the hotel or motel on the same terms and conditions as authorized in the Class AA license. Not more than two (2) Class AA-1 licenses may be issued to a holder of a Class AA license.
- (2) Class BW licenses (sidewalk cafe option), may be issued to any license holder of a Class A, AA, B or BB license ("main license") whose business establishment is primarily engaged in the sale and consumption of food on premise. If the additional fee for the sidewalk cafe liquor option (BW), as set forth in Section 14-7 of the Urbana City Code is paid to the City, the BW license shall permit the sale only of beer and wine (or only beer if the main license is Class B) by the license holder within the area for which the licensee also holds a valid sidewalk cafe permit issued by the Director of Public Works."

Section 2. That Section 14-7 of the Urbana City Code is hereby amended to provide as follows:

"BW - Initial License \$30.00, Renewal \$15.00"

Section 3. That Section 3-42(a)(3) is hereby amended to strike the reference to ten (10) days and insert in its place the words thirty (30) days.

Section 4. That Section 3-49(a) of the Liquor Code shall be amended to read as follows:

- "(a) Any license to sell alcoholic beverages issued or to be issued by the City of Urbana, may be made subject to security plan regulations in accordance with this chapter:
  - (1) After the occurrence of:
    - (a) Any incident on the licensed premises which involved fighting, excessive noise, and/or unruly behavior; or
    - (b) Any such incident near the licensed premises in which patrons of that licensed premises participated or were involved; or
    - (c) Underage drinking or sales to minors.
  - (2) Or if, because the license holder is scheduling a special event, the Chief of Police reasonably anticipates the need for extra security measures to protect the public order."

Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form by authority of the corporate authorities, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council.
