

ORDINANCE 9798-119

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF CERTAIN COMPUTER EQUIPMENT TO THE URBAN LEAGUE OF CHAMPAIGN COUNTY

WHEREAS, state statues provide that whenever a municipality owns any personal property, which in the opinion of three-fourths of the Corporate Authorities then holding office is no longer necessary or useful to the City, then by Ordinance, the Corporate Authorities may authorize the disposition of that personal property in such a manner as they designate, and

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana periodically accumulates small personal computer components and equipment that are of no or little value, and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities hereby determine that the City of Urbana no longer has any need or use for these periodically accumulated small items of computer equipment, and

WHEREAS, the Urban League of Champaign County is operating a program that accepts the donation of used computer components and equipment, that utilizes these computer components and equipment to train persons (mainly students) in the skills of working on and upgrading personal computers, and that then donates these assembled and upgraded personal computers to persons that due to economic and other reasons would not normally acquire personal computers,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Chief Administrative Officer of the City of Urbana upon recommendation by the Comptroller may donate used computer components and equipment to the Urban League of Champaign County, after having

determined that it is no longer necessary for the City of Urbana to own and utilize these computer components and equipment and having determined that the value of any individual computer component or item of equipment is less than \$50.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect immediately on and after its passage and approval.

This ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a three-fourths majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of the said Council.
