

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SCHEDULE A OF SECTION 23-62
OF THE URBANA LOCAL TRAFFIC CODE INCREASING
STATE SPEED LIMITS IN CERTAIN ZONES**

(Philo Road)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That Schedule A of Section 23-62, entitled "Increasing State Speed Limits in Certain Zones" of Article V of the Urbana Local Traffic Code, is hereby amended by ADDING to that schedule the following speed regulations for a certain portion of Philo Road:

From the southern edge of South Ridge V Subdivision to the southern edge of the Windsor Road right of way the speed limit shall be forty-five miles per hour (45 MPH).

Section 2. That the Traffic Engineer is hereby authorized and directed to post the appropriate signs indicating the speed regulations set forth in this Ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall not be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or a liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing prior to the effective date of this Ordinance; nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired, or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 5. The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form by authority of the corporate authorities, and this Ordinance

shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council.


