ORDINANCE NO. 2006-07-090

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF GROUNDWATER AS A POTABLE WATER SUPPLY BY THE INSTALLATION OR USE OF POTABLE WATER SUPPLY WELLS OR BY ANY OTHER METHOD

(Pride Oil, 1701 South Philo Road)

WHEREAS, certain properties in the City of Urbana, Illinois have been used over a period of time for commercial/industrial purposes; and

WHEREAS, because of said use, concentrations of certain chemical constituents in the groundwater beneath the City of Urbana may exceed Class I groundwater quality standards for potable resource groundwater as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code Part 620 or Tier 1 residential remediation objectives as set forth in 35 Illinois Administrative Code Part 742; and

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana desires to limit potential threats to human health from groundwater contamination while facilitating the redevelopment and productive use of properties that are the source of said chemical constituents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. Use of groundwater as a potable water supply is prohibited. Except for such uses or methods in existence before the effective date of this ordinance, the use or attempt to use as a potable water supply groundwater from those portions of the following described area that are within the corporate limits of the City of Urbana by the installation or drilling of wells or by any other method is hereby prohibited. This prohibition expressly includes the City of Urbana. The area of prohibition is defined as the source of the release at the property located in the southwest quadrant of the intersection of Philo Road and Florida Avenue and all that area within a minimum radial distance of 1,000 feet in every

direction there from; which includes an area roughly bounded by Michigan Avenue on the north, by the southern extension of Lanore Drive on the east, by Colorado Avenue on the south, and by Cottage Grove Avenue on the west (reference Exhibit A).

Section 2. <u>Penalties</u>. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of up to \$500.00 for each violation. Section 3. Definitions.

"Person" is any individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm, company, limited liability company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, political subdivision, or any other legal entity, or their legal representatives, agents or assigns.

"Potable water" is any water used for human or domestic consumption, including, but not limited to, water used for drinking, bathing, swimming, washing dishes, or preparing foods.

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they are in conflict with this ordinance.

Section 5. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or under any circumstances is adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or of any portion not adjudged invalid.

Section 6. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

Section 7. <u>Publication</u>. The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form by authority of the corporate authorities, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council.
