

RESOLUTION

Believing in the basic worth of every individual, and believing that the best interests of all Citizens can be furthered to greatest advantage in an atmosphere of understanding and cooperation, it is hereby resolved that the City of Urbana, shall be committed to a policy of equal employment, status, and treatment for all citizens without regard to race, religion, or national origin insofar as the City has authority under the Constitution and Status of the State of Illinois.

Furthermore we urge all citizens of Urbana, individually and collectively, to act in accord with such policy.

Adopted by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, this 7th day of October, 1963.

On September 16, 1963, a COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION FOR A BI-RACIAL COMMITTEE FOR THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, failed adoption by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, by a vote of nine to five.

On October 7, 1963, Alderman Skadden introduced a RESOLUTION committing the City to a policy of equal employment, status and treatment and urging a like policy for all citizens. Said RESOLUTION was duly adopted.
