

RESOLUTION OF PROTEST

WHEREAS, certain Petitioners have originated a proposed textual amendment concerning the definition and location of truck-stops, and the size of signs for same, and;

WHEREAS, the said proposal is being considered by the various governmental authorities under the style and name of "CCZBA Case No. 202-AT-76", and;

WHEREAS, after due notice and public hearing on the said question, the Urbana Plan Commission forwarded its recommendation to the Urbana City Council that the Urbana City Council protest the proposed textual amendments to the County Zoning Ordinance, contained in the said CCZBA Case No. 202-AT-76, and;

WHEREAS, the Urbana City Council, having duly considered all matters pertaining to, finds and determines that the proposed textual amendment would not be in the best interests of the City of Urbana and its citizens.


NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Urbana City Council that:

1. This City Council finds and determines that the facts contained in the above recitations are true.


