MASS TRANSIT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a public transportation system contributes to the general welfare; and

WHEREAS, public transportation conserves energy and reduces pollution; and

WHEREAS, the Mass Transit District is striving to make mass transit accessible to all; and

WHEREAS, recent polls indicate that people desire extended service and additional routes; and

WHEREAS, many people, including the elderly, handicapped and youth, are dependent upon the public transport for travel; and

WHEREAS, the Mass Transit District had a 34% increase in ridership last year which indicated good management; and

WHEREAS, additional buses will be purchased with the increased funds and the buses will be equipped to service handicapped; and

WHEREAS, federal matching funds will become available to purchase the buses and increase service.


